# How to Determine Eligibility to Register with the College of Homeopaths of Ontario

Individuals who have NOT graduated from an approved program in homeopathy in Ontario must demonstrate their education and training is substantially equivalent to an Ontario graduate of an approved program. To complete the Substantially Equivalent Competence Assessment (SECA) to demonstrate equivalence take the following

steps.

#### **READ THE SECA HANDBOOK**

From the College website download and read the Substantially Equivalent Competence Assessment (SECA) Handbook

**SEND FORM B** 

Send Form B - Certificate of Dean or Principal to your educational institution(s).

## **GATHER SUPPORTING INFORMATION**

Gather information including education program syllabus, detailed course descriptions, training logs for every homeopathy related learning activity completed.

## COMPLETE A SELF-ASSESSMENT REFLECTION FORM ON ENTRY-TO-PRACTICE

**COMPETENCIES AND REQUIREMENTS** (Download from College website.)

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#### DECLARE LANGUAGE FLUENCY OR COMPLETE LANGUAGE ASSESSMENT

Fluency in either French or English is required. Language fluency can be proven in 1 of 3 ways:

- 1. Declaration French or English is the potential applicant's first language and they speak it fluently;
- 2. The individual completed a post-secondary education program in homeopath that was taught in English or French; or
- Successful completion of a Canadian Language Benchmark assessment minimum level 7 through the Centre for Canadian Language Benchmark at http://www.language.ca/.



#### TRANSLATE DOCUMENTS

If documents are in a language other than English or French, the documents must be translated by a certified translator prior to submission.

#### COMPLETE AND SUBMIT PRE-ASSESSMENT FORM I

Complete and submit the paper based Form I to the CHO office with supporting documents and payment. Then mail a package of all required supporting documents to the College that are noted in the **SECA Application Checklist** (this includes 3, 4, 5 and 6 listed above).




#### INFORMATION RECEIVED AND REVIEWED

The College will notify you when your application form and <u>all</u> supporting documents have been received. It could take up to 20 weeks to process and review your SECA file. Applicants will be notified if there is any missing information. Applicants will receive a progress report every four weeks.



### **INTERVIEW WITH SECA ASSESSOR**

Once the potential applicant is ready, he or she must schedule a three-hour one-to-one meeting inperson or by video conference with a SECA Assessor. The interview covers a series of questions on homeopathy theory and clinical care. A preparation guide is available to all SECA applicants.



If the file review demonstrates substantial equivalence of education and training, the Registrar will inform the individual so he/she may submit an application for registration in Full Class. The individual may proceed to complete the registration process.

OR

# REFERRAL TO REGISTRATION COMMITTEE

If gaps are identified the Registrar will refer the file to the Registration Committee.



## **GAPS IDENTIFIED ELIGIBLE WITH ACTION**

If the review demonstrates gaps in the individual's education and training, the Registration Committee may recommend further education, training or refreshment; upon successful completion the individual may submit an application for registration.

Applicants may complete these steps in any order. It is possible to complete some steps concurrently.

Declaration of language fluency is part of the application process. For information on Canadian Language Benchmark (CLB) Assessment contact Assessment prices are set by CLB. Submit assessment form to College.

If not a graduate of an approved program in homeopathy in Ontario, \$150 + HST for SECA review to determine if education and training is substantially equivalent. Submit your fee payment directly to the College.

## Complete these steps ONLY after receiving notification of eligibility from the CHO.

- i. Create a CHO user account
- ii. Complete the Individual Assessment
- iii. Complete Jurisprudence Program
- iv. Gather Supporting Documents including Healthcare Provider CPR and Standard First Aid, Criminal Background Check, and Professional Liability Insurance
- v. Send Form C Certificate of Professional Conduct if registered with another regulatory body
- Submit application to the College of Homeopaths of Ontario

# SUBSTANTIAL EQUIVALENCE

OR

**NOT DEMONSTRATED** If the review demonstrates gaps in the individual's education and training that are significant, the Registration Committee may require the individual to undertake a program in homeopathy in Ontario prior to being considered eligible for registration.
